





Otto Layman (Director), now in his 18th year as head of the Theatre Department at Santa Barbara High School, Otto has directed Chicago (2013) Cabaret (2013), The Glass Menagerie (2013), SPAMALOT (2013), The Drowsy Chaperone (2012), Into the Woods (2012), Alice in Wonderland (2011), Anything Goes (2011), Little Shop of Horrors (2010), Singin' in the Rain (2010), Pinocchio (2009), Footloose (2009), A Village Fable (2008), Hair (2008), Beauty and the Beast (2008) & Peter Pan (2007); The Pajama Game (2007) & Still Life with Iris (2006); On the Town (2006) & The Wind in the Willows (2005); Carnival! (2005) & The Ash Girl (2004); Copacabana! (2004) & Mrs. McThing (2003); The Wizard of Oz (2003) & Gentlemen Prefer Blondes (2002); A Tale of Two Cities (2002) & Fright Night (2001); Into the Woods (2001) & Alice in Wonderland (which he also adapted) (2000); Once in a Lifetime & Durang, Durang (1999); A History of the American Film, On the Razzle, & At This Evening's Performance (1999); You Can't Take It With You, The Three Penny Opera, & Night of Once Acts (1998); Alice Underground, A Night of One Acts, & The Musical Comedy Murders of 1940 (1997); and The Raven (1996). A longtime member of the Ensemble Theatre as an actor and Playwright in Residence, Otto received his A.A. in English Literature from San Diego Mesa College (1980); a B.A. in English Literature from UCSB (1982); an M.A. in Creative Writing from Boston University (1987); and a Master's in Education from UCSB (1996).

Christina McCarthy (Choreographer), is currently a Lecturer in the Department of Theater and Dance at UCSB. She has choreographed multiple shows for Santa Barbara High School. She has choreographed for Santa Barbara Dance Theater, Santa Barbara City College Theater Group, Ensemble Theater, UC Santa Barbara Student Company and Santa Barbara Festival Ballet. At SBHS she has choreographed shows including The Little Shop of Horrors (2010), Anything Goes (2011), Alice in Wonderland (for which she created various puppets (2011), Into the Woods (2012), The Drowsy Chaperone (2012), SPAMALOT (2013), Cabaret (2013), Chicago (2013) and many more. She is also the resident costume designer for La Petite Chouette Aerial Arts Company. She is thankful for the loving support of her family in all her artistic endeavors.

Who's Who?

Jon Nathan (Musical Director), has been a figure in the Santa Barbara musical scene since his arrival here in 1992. He holds a Bachelor of Music in Jazz Studies from the University of Massachusetts, Amherst, and a Master of Music in Percussion Performance from California State University at Northridge. During his time there, he was introduced to William Kraft, and was asked to continue studies with Professor Kraft at UCSB, where he completed his Doctor of Musical Arts degree. Currently, Dr. Nathan is principal timpanist with Opera Santa Barbara as well as Director of Jazz Ensembles and Lecturer in Percussion and Percussion Ensemble at UCSB. He has served as Jazz Ensemble Director and Percussion Instructor at Moorpark College, has taught Techniques of Percussion at and private percussion lessons at Westmont College, and was the Applied Music Percussion Instructor at Santa Barbara City College. Dr. Nathan is also an endurance athlete having completed two Ironman triathlons and in November of 2012 competed in the Santa Barbara Red Rock 50 Mile Trail Race, and is very interested in the physical and mental connection between endurance training and racing and music performance preparation and performance.

Brent Wilson (Vocal Director), is a tenor, conductor, and stage director now in his fourth season as Assistant Conductor and Chorus Master for Opera Santa Barbara, where his work has been critically praised as "simply superb" and "deserving of special kudos." This season, he recently conducted Opera Santa Barbara's production of The Consul, staged Così fan tutee for both the North End Music and Performing Arts Center in Boston and Viterbo Opera; conducted the family performance of Opera Santa Barbara's Don Pasquale; and sang Mahler's Lieder eines fahrenden Gesellen for Ventura College, where he serves as Director of Opera and Voice. He has excelled in featured character roles for Boston Lyric Opera, Granite State Opera and Opera Santa Barbara, and he performed a staged version of Janácek's The Diary of One Who Vanished for Intermezzo Opera. He has performed with top choruses including Lyric Opera Chicago, Opera Theatre of Saint Louis, Boston Lyric Opera, and the Grammy-nominated ensemble Boston Baroque. He holds degrees from Boston University. Brent is training for his fifth Ironman race.

Mr. Madden's entire professional life has revolved around technical theatre. Bit by the theatre bug in high school, he went to CSU, Chico, and earned his degree in Theatre Arts. Along the way, he has designed and teched live theatre all over Northern and Southern California, Ashland, Oregon, and London, England. He has worked for roughly thirty different companies, and hundreds of shows as anything from deck hand to technical director, from designer to voice-over talent.




And I love this house, too, this joyful noise, and your children. I hope I never neglect to let them know. You tell
